WHY PAINT?

1.3 million pounds of paint go unused **each year** in Missouri.

Paint is recyclable. Paint stewardship program manages leftover paint responsibly.



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

- Improves **access** to properly dispose left-over paint;
- Retailers **volunteer** to serve as a drop-off location;
- Program will pick up paint collected at municipal HHW programs **for no charge**;
- Program offers a **free service to painting contractors, property managers, and others with large amount of leftover architectural paint.**
- Program will pay for paint **collection events** in areas not served by retail or facility options;
- serves both residents **and** businesses.
- Program is currently in 12 states and Washington D.C;



HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS



- PaintCare Inc., a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, **represents paint manufacturers** to plan and operate paint stewardship programs in U.S. states and jurisdictions that pass paint stewardship laws.
- The program allows for residents and businesses to **conveniently drop off paint for no charge** at any participating collection site, including existing HHW facilities and retail locations.

HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS CONT.

- The Missouri Department of Natural Resources would be the oversight agency to ensure compliance. PaintCare fees pay for MDNR staff time to review the plan and annual reports.
- If Missouri passes the bill, **all fees and program funds stay in Missouri** and are not used for any other state program.
- The fiscal note for this bill is **\$0**.



HOW IS THE PROGRAM FUNDED?



Program is financed through a per-can assessment fee*, calculated to cover the cost of the program, added to the product price of each container sold:

- | | |

| • Half pint or less: | \$0.00 |
| • Larger than half pint to less than one gallon: | \$0.35 |
| • One gallon: | \$0.75 |
| • Larger than one gallon to five gallons: | \$1.60 |

Manufacturers pay monthly fees to PaintCare based on sales in the state and pass them to distributors and retailers, who add them to the purchase price of paint


The fee pays for all aspects of operating the paint stewardship program, including collection, transportation, proper disposal, and education.


PaintCare has launched programs in 12 states and the District of Columbia.

- Landfilled



- Warrensburg – 7 events in 2024; Sat, April 20th -9am-1pm, Sat, May 18th, 9am-1pm, Sat, June 21st, 5-9pm, Sat, July 20th, 9am-1pm, Fri, Aug 16th, 5-9pm, Sat, Sep 21st, 9am-1pm & Sat, Oct 19th, 9am-1pm
- Lexington – by appointment only
- Mayview – 3rd Saturday of the month (1pm-3 pm) through December 2024
- Versailles – by appointment and 2nd Wednesday of the month (8 am-12)
- Sedalia – by appointment only
- Marshall – 4th Wednesday April – November only and by appointment only (8 am-12)
- **No latex paint accepted**
- Households only
